First Sunday of Advent Year A 27 November 2022.

Dear sisters and brothers in Christ

Both NT Readings for this First Sunday of Advent invite us to reflect on our living out of the Gospel of Jesus in our own time and place.

They encourage us to examine how we are faithful or otherwise to our Christian ethics in our day-to-day lives.

In preparation for that moment when we will see the Lord face-to-face, can we say that we are people of moral integrity, whose lives witness the love of Christ to all?

Do we strive for what is the right thing to do in all circumstances: for ourselves, our family, our friends, our neighbours, the strangers whom we meet?

As with last week (the end of our Church's Liturgical Year), so with this week (the beginning of a new Liturgical Year), it is the appropriate time to ask ourselves: are we in need of conversion and renewal?

Indeed, are we willing to prepare for the Lord's coming to us once again this Christmas by doing all we can to be reconciled with the Lord and one another, so that our celebration of Christmas 2022 may truly be a celebration of New Birth?

We see this most clearly in this first Sunday with readings that tell us the identity of the pilgrims, the destination toward which they travel, and the way of life that



is required of them on their journey. As the Vatican Council has proclaimed: We are a pilgrim people.

Both the reading from Isaiah and the psalm response speak of the pilgrimage to the mountain of the Lord, the place where God can be found. Although the psalm speaks about Jerusalem and refers to the temple there, the broader theological significance of the mountain, the city and the temple is one and the same. They represent the presence of God in our midst, and this presence is the goal of our striving. There are clear directions about how we are to live while we are on this pilgrimage to God. In Isaiah we learn that we must put away our instruments of violence and hatred, our swords and our spears. Lest we pick them up again, we are told to convert them into life-producing implements, into ploughs and pruning hooks. Paul exhorts us to put away our deeds of darkness and self-indulgence and to clothe ourselves instead in the deeds of Jesus Christ. Matthew points out the need for alertness, attentiveness, a disposition that is open to a change of heart.

A reading from the letter of St Paul to the Romans (Rom 13:11-14)

You know 'the time' has come: you must wake up now: our salvation is even nearer than it was when we were converted. The night is almost over, it will be daylight soon – let us give up all the things we prefer to do under the cover of the dark; let us arm ourselves and appear in the light. Let us live decently as people do in the daytime: no drunken orgies, no promiscuity or licentiousness, and no wrangling or jealousy. Let your armour be the Lord Jesus Christ.

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Matthew (Mt 24:37 -44)

You may be quite sure of this that if the householder had known at what time of the night the burglar would come, he would have stayed awake and would not have allowed anyone to break through the wall of his house.
