Second Sunday of Easter Year A 16 April 2023

Dear sisters and brothers in Christ

The common thread in today's readings is faith.

In the first reading we encounter a utopian society built on faith. Liberated from fear of not having financial security, being cheated by others and the existential threat of loss of identity. Their identity was being the children of God, better than money in the bank according to the second reading.

What is faith?

Is it believing that God exists?

No, that's not it. Satan not only believes God exists; he knows it, but it's not doing him any good.

He trusts in himself and his agendas, agendas twisted by billions wrong decisions.

Faith is trusting in God. Christ points out to Thomas the holes in his hands and feet. The hole in His side. These are the signs that God can be trusted. Look at what He has endured to set us free. Free from our twisted agendas which are the manifestations of our own psychological issues brought about by our own wrong decisions and those of others.

Being Divine Mercy Sunday, it's very important to point out how Christ sets us free. It's through the Holy Spirit. Look at the Gospel reading. It's the Holy Spirit which Christ imparts that gives the power to forgive sin. But God's mercy is much, much more than just forgetting what we've done wrong. It's the gift of the Holy Spirit which comes to heal our minds and souls, our psyche. God's mercy is healing and he's longing to impart it to us. It comes through the Holy Spirit, that's why the Sacrament of Reconciliation can only be administered by a Priest, because only a Priest can evoke the Holy Spirit. It is only through this healing that we will be able to really turn to God, to stop making so many wrong decisions and live in the freedom of the children of God.

***The themes for the second Sunday of Easter set the tone for the entire Easter season. They are all directed toward mystagogical instruction, primarily of the neophytes who were baptised during the Easter Vigil, but also of the whole Christian community. The readings for this



season provide us an extended meditation on the resurrection and on our own incorporation into it through the mysteries of initiation.

Most of us are like Thomas who looked for some tangible evidence of the resurrection. We do not find it any easier to live by faith than he did. However, when we do live by faith, we actually discover tangible proof. This proof can be seen in the way the community reaches out in care and support to others. Jesus extends his wounded hands to us as he did to Thomas, and the community is invited to touch his wounds as we touch the wounds of our world. We find a similar situation in the reading from Acts where the fledgling Christian community grew in number as a result of the teaching of the apostles. So it has always been. Those who are not eye witnesses of the actual events are called, through the teaching of others, to witness to the power of the resurrection.

Although the blessings that we derive from the resurrection are clearly gifts from God, they are nonetheless costly gifts. They have been won through the blood of Christ, and we too may have to pay dearly for having received them.

ENTRANCE

Receive the joy of your glory, giving thanks to God, who has called you into the heavenly kingdom, alleluia.

First Reading

A reading from the Acts of the Apostles (Acts 2:42-47)

The whole community remained faithful to the teaching of the apostles, to the fellowship, to the breaking of bread and to the prayers.

The many miracles and signs worked through the apostles made a deep impression on everyone.

The faithful all lived together and owned everything in common; they sold their goods and possessions and shared out the proceeds among themselves according to what each one needed.

They went as a body to the Temple every day but met in their houses for the breaking of bread; they shared their food gladly and generously; they praised God and were looked up to by everyone. Day by day the Lord added to their community those destined to be saved.

RESPONSE Give thanks to the Lord for he is good; his love is everlasting. .

Second Reading

A reading from the first letter of St Peter (1 Pt 1:3-9) Blessed be God the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who in his great mercy has given us a new birth as his children, by raising Jesus Christ from the dead, so that we have a sure hope and the promise of an inheritance that can never be spoilt or soiled and never fade away, because it is being kept for you in the heavens. Through your faith, God's power will guard you until the salvation which has been prepared is revealed at the end of time. This is a cause of great joy for you, even though you may for a short time have to bear being plagued by all sorts of trials; so that, when Jesus Christ is revealed, your faith will have been tested and proved like gold – only it is more precious than gold, which is corruptible even though it bears testing by fire – and then you will have praise and glory and honour. You did not see him, yet you love him; and still without seeing him, you are already filled with a joy so glorious that it cannot be described, because you believe; and you are sure of the end to which your faith looks forward, that is, the salvation of your souls.

ACCLAMATION

Alleluia, alleluia!

You believe in me, Thomas, because you have seen me; Blessed are those who have not seen me, but still believe! Alleluia!

Gospel

A reading from the holy Gospel according to John (Jn 20:19-31)

In the evening of that same day, the first day of the week, the doors were closed in the room where the disciples were, for fear of the Jews. Jesus came and stood among them. He said to them, 'Peace be with you,' and showed them his hands and his side. The disciples were filled with joy when they saw the Lord, and he said to them again, 'Peace be with you.

'As the Father sent me,

so am I sending you.'

After saying this he breathed on them and said:

'Receive the Holy Spirit.

For those whose sins you forgive,

they are forgiven;

for those whose sins you retain,

they are retained.'

Thomas, called the Twin, who was one of the Twelve, was not with them when Jesus came. When the disciples said, 'We have seen the Lord', he answered, 'Unless I see the holes that the nails made in his hands and can put my finger into the holes they made, and unless I can put my hand into his side, I refuse to believe.' Eight days later the disciples were in the house again and Thomas was with them. The doors were closed, but Jesus came in and stood among them. 'Peace be with you' he said. Then he spoke to Thomas, 'Put your finger here; look, here are my hands. Give me your hand; put it into my side. Doubt no longer but believe.' Thomas replied, 'My Lord and my God!' Jesus said to him:

'You believe because you can see me.

Blessed are those who believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God, and have not seen and yet believe.'

There were many other signs that Jesus worked and the disciples saw, but they are not recorded in this book. These are recorded so that you may that believing this you may have life through his name.

COMMUNION

Bring your hand and feel the place of the nails, and do not be unbelieving but believing, alleluia.
