Pentecost Sunday Year A 28 May 2023

Dear sisters and brothers in Christ

This Sunday is Pentecost Sunday.

The disciples come out from their room, where they were closed in for fear of the Jews and they engage with everyone they meet outside, speaking the language of the person to spread the Gospel of Christ, the coming of the Kingdom of God.

This passage is for us, the Church today. We need to really believe in God, not that God exists, but that God will take care of us no matter what difficulties arise and so leave our fears behind.

Freed from fear we can go out to build relationships with all those we meet. These relationships are bonds between God and the world. We are the bond because we are in Christ.

But to be effective we need to build our relationship with Christ. We need to be in Christ and Christ in us. We don't operate alone, we only function through Him, with Him and in Him. Through Christ we attain the Spirit which gives us understanding, frees us from fear and let's us use the gifts that the second reading talks about to build relationships with people.

So, as we pray, contemplate and seek Christ in our lives let's not forget that our faith is not a private faith. We seek unity with Christ so as to bring about unity of all of humanity with Him. We seek to bring the Spirit into the world through us uniting the world to Christ. That's our mission, our vocation.

Pentecost Sunday Year A

ENTRANCE

The love of God has been poured into our hearts through the Spirit of God dwelling within us, alleluia.

First Reading

A reading from the Acts of the Apostles (Acts 2:1-11)

When Pentecost day came round, the apostles had all met in one room, when suddenly they heard what sounded like a powerful wind from heaven, the noise of which filled the entire house in which they were sitting; and something appeared to them that seemed like tongues of fire; these separated and came to rest on the head of each of them. They were all filled with the Holy Spirit, and began to speak foreign languages as the Spirit gave them the gift of speech.

Now there were devout men living in Jerusalem from every nation under heaven, and at this sound they all assembled, each one bewildered to hear these men speaking his own language. They were amazed and astonished. 'Surely' they said 'all these men speaking are Galileans? How does it happen that each of us hears them in his own native language? Parthians, Medes and Elamites; people from Mesopotamia, Judaea and Cappadocia, Pontus and Asia, Phrygia and Pamphylia, Egypt and the parts of Libya round Cyrene; as well as visitors from Rome – Jews and proselytes alike – Cretans and Arabs; we hear them preaching in our own language about the marvels of God.'

RESPONSE

Lord, send out your Spirit and renew the face of the earth.

Second Reading

A reading from the first letter of St Paul to the Corinthians (1 Cor 12:3-7, 12-13)

No one can say, 'Jesus is Lord' unless he is under the influence of the Holy Spirit.

There is a variety of gifts but always the same Spirit; there are all sorts of service to be done, but always to the same Lord; working in all sorts of different ways in different people, it is the same God who is working in all of them. The particular way in which the Spirit is given to each person is for a good purpose.

Just as a human body, though it is made up of many parts, is a single unit because all these parts, though many, make one body, so it is with Christ. In the one Spirit we were all baptised, Jews as well as Greeks, slaves as well as citizens, and one Spirit was given to us all to drink.

Sequence

Holy Spirit, Lord of light, From the clear celestial height Thy pure beaming radiance give. Come, thou Father of the poor, Come with treasures which endure; Come, thou light of all that live! Thou, of all consolers best, Thou, the soul's delightful guest, Dost refreshing peace bestow; Thou in toil art comfort sweet; Pleasant coolness in the heat; Solace in the midst of woe. Light immortal, light divine, Visit thou these hearts of thine, And our inmost being fill: If thou take thy grace away, Nothing pure in man will stay; All his good is turned to ill. Heal our wounds, our strength renew; On our dryness pour thy dew; Wash the stains of guilt away: Bend the stubborn heart and will; Melt the frozen, warm the chill; Guide the steps that go astray. Thou, on us who evermore Thee confess and thee adore, With thy sevenfold gifts descend: Give us comfort when we die; Give us life with thee on high; Give us joys that never end.

ACCLAMATION

Alleluia, alleluia! Come, Holy Spirit, fill the hearts of your faithful and kindle in them the fire of your love. Alleluia!

<u>Gospel</u>

A reading from the holy Gospel according to John (Jn 20:19-23) In the evening of the first day of the week, the doors were closed in the room where the disciples were, for fear of the Jews. Jesus came and stood among them. He said to them, 'Peace be with you', and showed them his hands and his side. The disciples were filled with joy when they saw the Lord, and he said to them again, 'Peace be with you.

'As the Father sent me,

so am I sending you.'

After saying this he breathed on them and said:

'Receive the Holy Spirit.

For those whose sins you forgive,

they are forgiven:

for those whose sins you retain,

they are retained.'

COMMUNION

They were all filled with the Holy Spirit and spoke of the marvels of God, alleluia.
