
Sacred Heart Parish

Corpus Christi Year A 11 June 2023

Dear sisters and brothers in Christ

As we celebrate the Solemnity of The Body and Blood of the Lord (Corpus Christi) this weekend, I felt the need to offer some instructions on the correct way to receive the Eucharist at mass. As Parish Priest, it is my responsibility to encourage everyone to follow the guidelines of our Church with regard to the Reception of the Lord in Holy Communion.

Please be aware that the Australian Bishops' Conference a number of years ago has asked us not to genuflect before receiving Communion, but to bow. Although genuflection is part of western Christianity's Tradition (flowing from the obeisance offered the Emperor in Rome and adopted for the Liturgy), WH&S needs demand that we simply bow, so as to avoid tripping the person behind us. Furthermore, kneeling to receive communion is a similar difficulty, being a major trip hazard.

When you receive communion, please place your main hand under your other hand, and allow the Priest or Minister to place the host there, before you 'Take and Eat' with your main hand. Do not attempt to grab the host; nor put your finger on it before the minister has withdrawn his/her fingers - both actions can create hygiene issues.

If you wish to receive Communion on the tongue, please stick your tongue out and allow the Priest or Minister to place it on your tongue. It is preferable that you close your eyes and not lunge towards the host; this can result in the minister's hand being licked - a more serious hygiene issue.

Of course, when the minister says 'The Body of Christ', you must say "AMEN"; in so doing you are declaring that you believe in Christ's Presence in the Blessed Sacrament.

I offer all these comments for everyone's reflection, so that the receiving of the Eucharist is faithful to the living Tradition of our Church, as adapted to contemporary needs.

Praying with Pope Francis for the month of June

For the abolition of torture

We pray that the international community may commit in a concrete way to ensuring the abolition of torture and guarantee support to victims and their families.

***This feast harkens back to the celebration of Holy Thursday. By way of the metaphors of food and drink, its readings provide us with a look at the mystery of divine presence. They first provide a picture of a God who feeds us. In the past God set a



table in freedom, and then provided food that enabled our ancestors to survive. God fed those who were needy, not those who were worthy. Jesus offered sustenance to the crowds that gathered around him. It was not manna from heaven that he offered but his own flesh and blood as food and drink. This food and drink are the pledge of eternal life.

Those who eat this bread and drink this cup are caught up in a profound unity with God, a unity not envisioned in the wilderness experience. There is a new overlay of significance. Jesus' claim to give his flesh and blood was a bold one, Paul's seems even bolder. He states that partaking of the bread and the cup not only joins us with Christ, but actually makes us participants in the body and blood of Christ. Humanity and divinity are joined as one. The Eucharist is a sign of unity in another way. Joined to the body and blood of Christ, we are joined to each other. We are one body and that body is Christ. The Eucharist is truly a celebration of thanksgiving: thanksgiving for our transformation and thanksgiving for our unity.

ENTRANCE

He fed them with the finest wheat and satisfied them with honey from the rock.

ACCLAMATION

Alleluia, alleluia!

I am the living bread from heaven, says the Lord; whoever eats this bread will live for ever. Alleluia!

First Reading

A reading from the book of Deuteronomy (Dt 8:2-3. 14-16) Moses said to the people: 'Remember how the Lord your God led you for forty years in the wilderness, to humble you, to test you and know your inmost heart – whether you would keep his commandments or not. He humbled you, he made you feel hunger, he fed you with manna which neither you nor your fathers had known, to make you understand that man does not live on bread alone but that man lives on everything that comes from the mouth of the Lord. 'Do not then forget the Lord your God who brought you out of the land of Egypt, out of the house of slavery: who guided you through this vast and dreadful wilderness, a land of fiery serpents, scorpions, thirst; who in this waterless place brought you water from the hardest rock; who in this wilderness fed you with manna that your fathers had not known.

RESPONSE

Praise the Lord, Jerusalem

Second Reading

A reading from the first letter of St Paul to the Corinthians (1 Cor 10:16-17)

The blessing-cup that we bless is a communion with the blood of Christ, and the bread that we break is a communion with the body of Christ. The fact that there is only one loaf means that, though there are many of us, we form a single body because we all have a share in this one loaf.

Gospel

A reading from the holy Gospel according to John (Jn 6:51-58) Jesus said to the Jews:

'I am the living bread which has come down from heaven.

Anyone who eats this bread will live for ever;

and the bread that I shall give

is my flesh, for the life of the world.'

Then the Jews started arguing with one another: 'How can this man give us his flesh to eat?' they said. Jesus replied:

'I tell you most solemnly,

if you do not eat the flesh of the Son of Man and drink his blood.

you will not have life in you.

Anyone who does eat my flesh and drink my blood has eternal life.

and I shall raise him up on the last day.

For my flesh is real food

and my blood is real drink.

He who eats my flesh and drinks my blood

lives in me

and I live in him.

As I, who am sent by the living Father,

myself draw life from the Father,

so whoever eats me will draw life from me.

This is the bread come down from heaven;

not like the bread our ancestors ate:

they are dead,

but anyone who eats this bread will live for ever.

COMMUNION

Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood remains in me and I in him, says the Lord.
