23rd Sunday in Ordinary Time Year A 10 Sept 2023

Dear sisters and brothers in Christ

In the first reading this Sunday God tells Ezekiel that it's his responsibility to point out the wrong doings of the people of Israel.

In the Gospel Christ gives instructions to His Disciples as to how they are to handle any disagreements within the Church.

In the second reading St Paul tells us that all the commandments are based on the principle of love. That is, wanting the good of the other.

So, there is a common thread: responsibility.

We are responsible for the good of the other. We are responsible to love our fellow human beings. For love is wanting the good of the other.

But love implies that the want is not based on a compulsion of duty but rather a connection based on a rational and emotional connection.

This responsibility of love means that we need to consider the people we encounter in their wholeness.

We need to be concerned for their physical, emotional (psychological) and spiritual wellbeing.

We are all in need of some form of help, that is why when we interact with people we need to actually care about the person. Actively listen. Actively engage. We all have the means to engage, we all have life experiences and memories that we can draw on to feel what the other person is talking about. Until we engage with our hearts our minds will not be able to focus on the other person.

We don't know what is needed in a particular person's life. It may all look okay, but that is never actually the case. They may just need to talk, and that's a very real need.

Even if we spot obvious needs, like financial needs very often there are a number of other needs as well, some possibly even contributing to the financial issues.

We should never preach pointing out wrongs and failings because in doing that we would be causing emotional damage, and also, quite possibly spiritual damage by driving people away.

But this care and concern, this genuine desire to see the good of the other is something that needs nurturing and growth. That's why we need to pray and receive the sacraments because these will turn an understanding of our responsibility as a duty into a desire to embrace our responsibility as an expression of the fact that we are children of God and we share in His pouring out of life into creation.

***It is difficult for leaders to call people to accountability. Such is the unenviable responsibility of pastors in the parish, coordinators of religious education, members of the parish council, principals in the school, directors of liturgical ministry, to name but a few. Disciples



liturgical ministry, to name but a few. Disciples must also engage in the very difficult process of reconciliation. Differences of opinion, misunderstandings, and actual offences tend to alienate people. We see this happen in families, neighbourhoods, parish communities, workplaces. It is not enough to say that we must try to forgive from our hearts. The process of reconciliation requires significant movement toward the admission of guilt as well. Both the one offended and the offender must be willing to be transformed.

Gathering two or three together in prayerful collaboration is not as easy as it sounds. If collaboration is to be effective, we have to be open and honest about our opinions and our biases, and respectful of the opinions and biases of others. We must work for the common good and not merely for what we personally think is best. We must be willing to accept and implement decisions with which we may not totally agree, and we must live with them gracefully. All of this calls for unselfish love. Love fulfils the entire law only: when we honour our personal commitments and the personal commitments of others; when we value the life, dignity and reputation of others; and when we respect their possessions. It is only because love is so demanding that it covers all of our responsibilities.

First Reading.

A reading from the prophet Ezekiel (Ezekiel 33:7-9)

The word of the Lord was addressed to me as follows, 'Son of man, I have appointed you as sentry to the House of Israel. When you hear a word from my mouth, warn them in my name. If I say to a wicked person: Wicked wretch, you are to die, and you do not speak to warn the wicked person to renounce their ways, then they shall die for their sin, but I will hold you responsible for their death. If, however, you do warn a wicked person to renounce their ways and repent, and they do not repent, then they shall die for their sin, but you yourself will have saved your life.'

RESPONSE

O that today you would listen to his voice! Harden not your hearts.

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Matthew (Matthew 18:15-20)

Jesus said to his disciples: 'If your brother or sister does something wrong, go and have it out with them alone, between your two selves. If they listens to you, you have won back your brother or sister. If they do not listen, take one or two others with you: the evidence of two or three witnesses is required to sustain any charge. But if they refuses to listen to these, report it to the community; and if they refuse to listen to the community, treat them like a pagan or a tax collector.

'I tell you solemnly, whatever you bind on earth shall be considered bound in heaven; whatever you loose on earth shall be considered loosed in heaven.

'I tell you solemnly once again, if two of you on earth agree to ask anything at all, it will be granted to you by my Father in heaven. For where two or three meet in my name, I shall be there with them.'

Second Reading .

A reading from the letter of St Paul to the Romans (Romans 13:8-10)

Avoid getting into debt, except the debt of mutual love. If you love your fellow human beings you have carried out your obligations. All the commandments: You shall not commit adultery, you shall not kill, you shall not steal, you shall not covet, and so on, are summed up in this single command: You must love your neighbour as yourself. Love is the one thing that cannot hurt your neighbour; that is why it is the answer to every one of the commandments.

COMMUNION

Like the deer that yearns for running streams, so my soul is yearning for you, my God; my soul is thirsting for God, the living God.
