29th Sunday in Ordinary Time Year A 22 October 2023

Dear sisters and brothers in Christ

This Sunday in the first reading we hear God addressing Cyrus, King of Persia and saying that He has given him power so that he can do what God wants done even though Cyrus does not know of God or His plans. God intends all people to know that aside from Him there is nothing. Nothing happens without God willing it or allowing it.

In the second reading we hear of the effect of the Good News on the Thessalonians. The utter conviction made manifest through works of faith and love.

In the Gospel we hear how the Pharisees tried to trap Christ. They had figured out that the parables of the Landowners sons, the wicked tenants and the invited guests who couldn't be bothered coming to the wedding banquet were about them.

Christ's replies to their trick question is quite deep. 'Very well, give back to Caesar what belongs to Caesar – and to God what belongs to God.' What is God's?

Everything.

This message is not only for the Pharisees, its just as much for us.

Everything we are and have has been given to us. Nothing is ours. It has been given to us so that we can bring about the Kingdom of justice, mercy, and love. The Kingdom of God. Just like Cyrus we have been given the opportunity to bring about God's plan.

All the good we have experienced and very much so all the bad are all tools in our hands to go about our work because it is the emotions associated with our memories and experiences that allow us to feel the pain and the hurt, humiliation, hopelessness and rejection of the other. This is the coinage to pay our taxes to God.

When we internalise the pain of the other through our own experience then we unite ourselves with them and can offer a prayer to God the Father through the Holy Spirit, the words of which are the pain and sorrow we feel for the other.

This is us being Eucharistic people, where we allow the hurt of others to gnaw at us so that we can become the conduit through which the help, the grace of God, can come into their lives.

So, in this time of so much bloodshed let's not think about sides and who's right and who's wrong but let us feel the anguish, emotional torment and hopeless of parents who have lost a child, of parents who have no food or water for their children, of children left crippled and orphaned. Those so beleaguered by destructive powers, that are beyond them, that they cry out: My God My God why have you abandoned me. Let us connect with those images and let's pray the Rosary (October is the month of the Rosary) holding that pain in our hearts that the grief of our souls becomes the groaning of the Spirit in a wordless pray to the Father of us all.



Let me see the money you pay the tax with.' They handed him a denarius, and he said, 'Whose head is this? Whose name?' 'Caesar's' they replied. He then said to them, 'Very well, give back to Caesar what belongs to Caesar – and to God what belongs to God.'
