1st Sunday of Advent Year B 3 December 2023

Dear sisters and brothers in Christ

In the Gospel this Sunday Christ tells us to stay awake because we have been left in charge and each one of us has work that needs to be done. The work that is assigned to us is for us and for us alone. We are all individuals with an individual relationship with God.

This work is essential for our union with Christ, and we will be answerable at the end of our lives, and at return of Christ the King when the new heaven and new earth come into being. Answerable in that we will give Christ the answer of whether we want to be in union with Him or not. His invitation is always open. It is our hearts that can closed.

Our closed hearts are something we must consider as we start to prepare for Christmas. Let's consider our heart as a hotel. Is it full of guests? Guests like our social status, our career, our financial security, our comfort, our physical well being or our identity? All these are normal and good in themselves as long as they are kept in perspective, as long as there is only one Ruler in our life and these things work to keep Him firmly in charge of our attitudes, thoughts words and actions.

This is what the first reading is telling us with the words: "No ear has heard, no eye has seen any god but you act like this for those who trust him. You guide those who act with integrity and keep your ways in mind". Our faith is our trust in God, in our seeking His will, not ours, being done in our lives. God's will gives us integrity. When we put our will first, when we let the media, Government or social networks or attitudes guide us we are clothing ourselves in filthy clothing described by the first reading that will prevent us from being at the wedding feast of heaven. This is us being asleep. Being awake is actively looking to do God's will

So, like the disciples on the way to Emmaus who recognised Jesus in the breaking of bread and "got up" and went back to Jerusalem, let us get up and go back to being more truly to being the Church, the Body of Christ. In recognising Jesus, in remember His love and how He broke down the barriers of separation to call people into His Kingdom, let us become the bread of life for the world and take Christ out into the world through our own individual lives and sacrifice ourselves (ie make ourselves holy) by letting people chew, draw life, from us through our generosity, understanding, compassion and genuine concern for the good of the other. Let us do all we can to break down barriers. In ever person we encounter Christ lies hidden, exclude them, estrange them, and you estrange Christ.

one who is coming, we live in the 'in between' time of ambiguity and hope. The placement of these readings at the beginning of Advent shapes the context for understanding the entire season. They fix our gaze on the world of human pain and then moves beyond it to the hope of a brighter future. Lamentation and expectation find fulfilment in the Day of the Lord.

Waiting is a prominent image this Sunday. Some people wait to be released from suffering, others await the second coming of Christ. Waiting saps our energies and stifles our enthusiasm. Yet wait we must, and as we wait, we wonder: 'What should I be doing?' The readings suggest that we should wait with patient expectation for the day of reconciliation and peace; we should wait in joyful hope that what is to come will come soon. While we wait, we should faithfully fulfil our responsibilities. We believe that we have a future worth waiting for, that there are promises that God will keep. And so we look expectantly to the Day of the Lord, that future day of ultimate fulfilment.
