FIFTH SUNDAY OF LENT. Year B- 17 March 2024

Dear sisters and brothers in Christ

All three biblical texts for this Fifth Sunday of Lent speak of dying to old ways so as to begin something new:

- * the Old Covenant is replaced by a 'new' Covenant, written in our hearts
- * it was Jesus' obedience unto death that established this New Covenant
- * and we need to die to self so as to rise to new life, just like the grain of wheat

Christ continually calls us to die to sin (our 'old ways' of living), so that we will experience new life in Him.

The very human obsession with self blinds us to the many possibilities that the Lord offers us.

It's only when self-centredness and its attendant selfishness are placed in the background of our lives that we are enabled to imitate the Master, and thus lead people to right relationship with the Lord.

And so, in our times of prayer and reflection during this penultimate week of Lent, let's ask ourselves...

- 1. Am I someone who has died to old ways so as to be alive to the New Covenant written in my heart?
- 2. Am I like the seed that is willing strip away the hard outer shell to discover the richness and potentiality of growth beneath?
- 3. Am I someone who is truly willing to imitate the Master and be obedient to the Father's Will even unto death?

'If someone serves me, they must follow me; wherever I am, my servant will be there too".

5th Sunday of Lent - Year B

ENTRANCE

Give me justice, O God,

and plead my cause against a nation that is faithless. From the deceitful and cunning rescue me, for you, O God, are my strength.

First Reading.

A reading from the prophet Jeremiah (Jeremiah 31:31-34) See, the days are coming – it is the Lord who speaks – when I will make a new covenant with the House of Israel and the House of Judah, but not a covenant like the one I made with their ancestors on the day I took them by the hand to bring them out of the land of Egypt. They broke that covenant of mine, so I had to show them who was master. It is the Lord who speaks. No, this is the covenant I will make with the House of Israel when those days arrive – it is the Lord who speaks. Deep within them I will plant my Law, writing it on their hearts. Then I will be their God and they shall be my people. There will be no further need for neighbour to try to teach neighbour, or brother to say to brother, 'Learn to know the Lord!' No, they will all know me, the least no less than the greatest – it is the Lord who speaks – since I will forgive their iniquity and never call their sin to mind.

RESPONSE Create a clean heart in me, O God.

Second Reading.

A reading from the letter to the Hebrews (Hebrews 5:7-9) During his life on earth, Christ offered up prayer and entreaty, aloud and in silent tears, to the one who had the power to save him out of death, and he submitted so humbly that his prayer was heard. Although he was Son, he learnt to obey through suffering; but having been made perfect, he became for all who obey him the source of eternal salvation.

ACCLAMATION

Glory to you, Word of God, Lord Jesus Christ! If you serve me, follow me, says the Lord; and where I am, my servant will also be. Glory to you, Word of God, Lord Jesus Christ!

Gospel

A reading from the holy Gospel according to John (John 12:20-33)

Among those who went up to worship at the festival were some Greeks. These approached Philip, who came from Bethsaida in Galilee, and put this request to him, 'Sir, we should like to see Jesus.' Philip went to tell Andrew, and Andrew and Philip together went to tell Jesus. Jesus replied to them:

'Now the hour has come

for the Son of Man to be glorified.

I tell you most solemnly,

unless a wheat grain falls on the ground and dies,

it remains only a single grain;

but if it dies,

it yields a rich harvest.

Anyone who loves their life loses it; anyone who hates their life in this world

will keep it for the eternal life.

If someone serves me, they must follow me, wherever I am, my servant will be there too.

If anyone serves me, my Father will honour them.

Now my soul is troubled.

What shall I say:

Father, save me from this hour?

But it was for this very reason that I have come to this hour.

Father, glorify your name!'

A voice came from heaven, 'I have glorified it, and I will glorify it again.'

People standing by, who heard this, said it was a clap of thunder; others said, 'It was an angel speaking to him.' Jesus answered, 'It was not for my sake that this voice came, but for yours.

'Now sentence is being passed on this world;

now the prince of this world is to be overthrown.

And when I am lifted up from the earth,

I shall draw all people to myself.'

By these words he indicated the kind of death he would die.

COMMUNION

Amen, Amen I say to you: Unless a grain of wheat falls to the ground and dies, it remains a single grain. But if it dies, it bears much fruit.
