### Fourth Sunday of Easter Year B-21 April 2024

Dear sisters and brothers in Christ

Today's First Reading and Gospel reminds us that Jesus, although rejected by the leaders of Israel (the hirelings under God), has proven to be the keystone to the whole edifice of faith in God.

Indeed, by his very action of willingly laying down his life for humankind, Jesus has shown himself to be the True Shepherd (carer, guide, leader) of faithfilled people (the sheep).

This was at the heart of the early proclamation of the Good News (kerygma) proclaimed by the Apostles.

And so, for those who see Jesus as both keystone and Good Shepherd, they are called 'children of God' - whose destiny to see God face-to-face is assured.

This Easter Proclamation gives us hope in the midst of the bad news of our contemporary world; it encourages us in our living out of our Faith; and it inspires us to imitate the Good Shepherd and be people of unconditional love.

My friends, as this 4th week of Eastertide unfolds, let's meditate on the willingness of the Good Shepherd to lay down his life for the sheep... and let us look at ways in which we can imitate Him in our daily lives.

- 1. ANZAC Day will be celebrated with Mass at 9am in both Sacred Heart Church, Blackheath and St Canice's Church, Katoomba. (Thus, no mass at Wentworth Falls that day).
- 2. Please note that next Saturday (27/4) we will be having a Gardening Working Bee for the front area of St Canice's. I encourage all (in both Upper Mountains parishes) who are able to come along to do so, so that we can make this very public area in the Main Street of Katoomba be a beautiful space.

Please bring any gardening tools (including wheelbarrows) that will aid us in the removal of weeds and the placing of soil and then mulch in our new garden beds

There are a number of bulbs and plants that will then need planting.

A sausage sizzle will be provided for the workers!

#### Fourth Sunday of Easter Year B

#### **ENTRANCE**

The merciful love of the Lord fills the earth; by the word of the Lord the heavens were made, alleluia.

#### First Reading.

A reading from the Acts of the Apostles (Acts of the Apostles 4:8-12)

Filled with the Holy Spirit, Peter said: 'Rulers of the people, and elders! If you are questioning us today about an act of kindness to a cripple, and asking us how he was healed, then I am glad to tell you all, and would indeed be glad to tell the whole people of Israel, that it was by the name of Jesus Christ the Nazarene, the one you crucified, whom God raised from the dead, by this name and by no other that this man is able to stand up perfectly healthy, here in your presence, today. This is the stone rejected by you the builders, but which has proved to be the keystone. For of all the names in the world given to men, this is the only one by which we can be saved.'

**RESPONSE** The stone rejected by the builders has become the cornerstone.

#### Second Reading.

A reading from the first letter of St John (1 John 3:1-2) Think of the love that the Father has lavished on us, by letting us be called God's children;

and that is what we are.

Because the world refused to acknowledge him,

therefore it does not acknowledge us.

My dear people, we are already the children of God but what we are to be in the future has not yet been revealed;

all we know is, that when it is revealed

we shall be like him

because we shall see him as he really is.

#### ACCLAMATION

Alleluia, alleluia!

I am the good shepherd, says the Lord;

I know my sheep, and mine know me.

Alleluia!

#### Gospel

A reading from the holy Gospel according to John (John 10:11-18)

Jesus said:

'I am the good shepherd:

the good shepherd is one who lays down his life for his sheep.

The hired man, since he is not the shepherd

and the sheep do not belong to him,

abandons the sheep and runs away

as soon as he sees a wolf coming,

and then the wolf attacks and scatters the sheep;

this is because he is only a hired man

and has no concern for the sheep.

I am the good shepherd;

I know my own

and my own know me,

just as the Father knows me

and I know the Father;

and I lay down my life for my sheep.

And there are other sheep I have

that are not of this fold,

and these I have to lead as well.

They too will listen to my voice,

and there will be only one flock

and one shepherd.

The Father loves me,

because I lay down my life

in order to take it up again.

No one takes it from me;

I lay it down of my own free will,

and as it is in my power to lay it down,

so it is in my power to take it up again;

and this is the command I have been given by my Father.'

#### **COMMUNION**

The Good Shepherd has risen, who laid down his life for his sheep and willingly died for his flock, alleluia.
