The 16th Sunday in Ordinary time Year B 21 July 2024

Dear sisters and brothers in Christ

Today's Gospel from Mark speaks of Jesus trying to take the Apostles away for a bit of R&R after their very successful Mission (last week's Gospel). But the crowds gues where Jesus is going, and reach the place before him. So he sets about preaching the Gospel, as they were like 'sheep without a shepherd'.

For me, this text reminds me that each and every one of us need to make certain that we take time to rest and recuperate after the busyness of work. Without such necessary 'time out; we are in danger of 'burn out'.

With the Christian lifestyle, we also need to spend time alone with the Lord, so our relationship with God can be renewed and strengthened. Without this our ministry can become hollow and superficial.

But the other point from the text is that when work arises, we cannot shirk our responsibilities. We have to remain faithful to our commitments, even if, at times, we would prefer to continue resting! For if we had one big holiday, we'd soon find ourselves asking for meaning in life!

Similarly, as Christians, we can't allow times of rest and renewal with the Lord to be used as an excuse to avoid practical ministry and care for others. This would be self-indulgence!

Prayer and religious devotion are not of value unless they issue forth in action. As one Scriptural Commentator (William Barclay) wrote:

"We must never seek the fellowship of God to avoid the fellowship of people, but to fit ourselves better for it. The rhythm of the Christian life is the alternative meeting with God in the secret place and serving people in the marketplace".

So, my friends, let's reflect on the movement in our lives: where is the emphasis? Is it on action? Is it on prayer and reflection? Is there a good balance between the two? Is there change needed in our attitudes and actions?

As always, let's ask our loving God for help and strength, for the grace of the Holy Spirit, so that we can put our reflections and resolutions into action!

***Jesus chose disciples to continue his work; he instructed them and empowered them. He sent them out on a mission, and they returned. People followed them, because they wanted to hear what Jesus and the disciples had to say; they wanted to be released from the sickness and the demons that possessed them.

There are so many searching people in the world today, people hungering for instruction, good people looking for direction. They may be parents who are sick with grief over the future of a troubled child; a man stripped of his dignity through unemployment; a woman facing a pregnancy alone; elderly people feeling the surge of life leave their declining bodies; people who are angry and confused because they believe that the church is no longer dependable. They are people who are looking for answers and for meaning. They are like sheep without a shepherd, and Jesus looks to us to shepherd them.

In the midst of this confusion, there are reliable shepherds who walk with us in the dark valleys. They are willing to share the dangers through which we pass, even at the risk of their own safety. They do not pit one segment of the community or one theological perspective against another, scattering the sheep and driving them away. Instead, they work to dismantle the walls that divide us. They speak the word that gathers us together. They reconcile us with God and with each other. They may not give us easy answers, but their primary concern is to lead us to Jesus, the one who is our peace.

ENTRANCE

See, I have God for my help.

First Reading.

A reading from the prophet Jeremiah (Jeremiah 23:1-6)

'Doom for the shepherds who allow the flock of my pasture to be destroyed and scattered – it is the Lord who speaks!

This, therefore, is what the Lord, the God of Israel, says about the shepherds in charge of my people: You have let my flock be scattered and go wandering and have not taken care of them. Right, I will take care of you for your misdeeds – it is the Lord who speaks!

But the remnant of my flock I myself will gather from all the countries where I have dispersed them, and will bring them back to their pastures: they shall be fruitful and increase in numbers. I will raise up shepherds to look after them and pasture them; no fear, no terror for A reading from the holy Gospel according to Mark (Mark them any more; not one shall be lost – it is the Lord who speaks!

'See, the days are coming – it is the Lord who speaks

when I will raise a virtuous Branch for David, who will reign as true king and be wise, practising honesty and integrity in the land. In his days Judah will be saved and Israel dwell in confidence. And this is the name he will be called:

The Lord-our-integrity.'

Second Reading.

A reading from the letter of St Paul to the **Ephesians (Ephesians 2:13-18)**

In Christ Jesus, you that used to be so far from us have been brought very close, by the blood of Christ.

For he is the peace between us, and has made the two into one and broken down the barrier which used to keep them apart, actually destroying in his own person the hostility caused by the rules and decrees of the Law.

This was to create one single New Man in himself out of the two of them and by restoring peace through the cross, to unite them both in a single Body and reconcile them with God.

In his own person he killed the hostility.

Later he came to bring the good news of peace, peace to you who were far away and peace to those who were near at hand.

Through him, both of us have in the one Spirit our way to come to the Father.
