Third Sunday of Advent C 15 December 2024

Dear sisters and brothers in Christ

This is Gaudete Sunday, that is: Rejoice Sunday.

The first reading tells us to shout for joy.

Zion or Israel refers to the people of God. Jerusalem refers to the Church.

But why? Because God will renew us by His love.

That's what the second reading is telling us when it says that the peace of God which is so much greater than we can understand will guide our hearts and our thoughts.

It's what St John the Baptist is talking about when he says that he baptises with water but Christ who comes after him Baptises with fire and the Holy Spirit.

The baptism of St John was a baptism of repentance. People called to changing their lives by moving away from self-centred interests.

But the Baptism of Christ fundamentally changes us as it gives us access to the Holy Spirit. It's what the Church calls an ontological change, a change in the way we exist.

This change is the love of God. When we come to an awareness of the unconditional love of God, not an understanding but an experience, a feeling of it, through which we come to trust in God and put all our fears aside and become sources of this same love to those around us. This is the renewal, the guidance of our hearts and thoughts.

But this is a lifelong journey. A struggle. Because in our relations we don't experience unconditional love, so the concept is largely foreign to us. If you like, it is not of this world.

But it can be, and it will be because this is why Christ came to us, to bring about the New Heaven and New Earth where Heaven and Earth are united.

The incarnation didn't just happen 2000 years ago, it's happening now. We are part of it. The whole of creation is being assumed into Christ through our merging with Him.

Coming to an awareness of this immense unconditional love of God which completely frees us is a long process.

One I struggle with. Everything around me, my life experiences, my understanding all pull me into a very different understanding of love and relationships and with it into fears and worries.

That's when I need to take time out to contemplate, to try and unjumble the mess in my head.

I'm saying this because this really is a long process. A process of coming to the realisation of a completely different reality but a process that is fundamental to our faith.



Third Sunday of Advent Year C

ENTRANCE

Rejoice in the Lord always; again I say, rejoice. Indeed, the Lord is near.

First Reading.

A reading from the prophet Zephaniah (Zephaniah 3:14-18)

Shout for joy, daughter of Zion,

Israel, shout aloud!

Rejoice, exult with all your heart,

daughter of Jerusalem!

The Lord has repealed your sentence;

he has driven your enemies away.

The Lord, the king of Israel, is in your midst; you have no more evil to fear.

When that day comes, word will come to Jerusalem: Zion, have no fear,

do not let your hands fall limp.

The Lord your God is in your midst,

a victorious warrior.

He will exult with joy over you,

he will renew you by his love;

he will dance with shouts of joy for you

as on a day of festival.

RESPONSE

Cry out with joy and gladness: for among you is the great and Holy One of Israel.

Second Reading.

A reading from the letter of St Paul to the Philippians (Philippians 4:4-7)

I want you to be happy, always happy in the Lord; I repeat, what I want is your happiness. Let your tolerance be evident to everyone: the Lord is very near. There is no need to worry; but if there is anything you need, pray for it, asking God for it with prayer and thanksgiving, and that peace of God, which is so much greater than we can understand, will guard your hearts and your thoughts, in Christ Jesus.

ACCLAMATION

Alleluia, alleluia!

The Spirit of the Lord is upon me;

he sent me to bring Good News to the poor.

Alleluia!

GOSPEL

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Luke (Luke 3:10-18)

When all the people asked John, 'What must we do?' he answered, 'If anyone has two tunics they must share with the one who has none, and the one with something to eat must do the same.' There were tax collectors too who came for baptism, and these said to him, 'Master, what must we do?' He said to them, 'Exact no more than your rate.' Some soldiers asked him in their turn, 'What about us? What must we do?' He said to them, 'No intimidation! No extortion! Be content with your pay!'

A feeling of expectancy had grown among the people, who were beginning to think that John might be the Christ, so John declared before them all, 'I baptise you with water, but someone is coming, someone who is more powerful than I am, and I am not fit to undo the strap of his sandals; he will baptise you with the Holy Spirit and fire. His winnowing-fan is in his hand to clear his threshing-floor and to gather the wheat into his barn; but the chaff he will burn in a fire that will never go out.' As well as this, there were many other things he said to exhort the people and to announce the Good News to them.
