In the Gospel we hear how overwhelmed and ecstatic Elizabeth was when she heard Mary's greeting. The child leapt in her womb, and she was filled with the Holy Spirit.

Elizabeth and her unborn child could feel the presence of God. But it was Mary who brought this presence of God to Elizabeth and the unborn John the Baptist.

There will be No Mass in the Megalong in January 2025.


January Dates for your Diary

Third Sunday of Advent Year C

ENTRANCE

Drop down dew from above, you heavens, and let the clouds rain down the Just One;

let the earth be opened and bring forth a Saviour.

First Reading.

A reading from the prophet Micah. (Micah 5:1-4) The Lord says this:

You, Bethlehem Ephrathah, the least of the clans of Judah, out of you will be born for me the one who is to rule over Israel; his origin goes back to the distant past, to the days of old.

The Lord is therefore going to abandon them till the time when she who is to give birth gives birth.

Then the remnant of his brothers will come back to the sons of Israel.

He will stand and feed his flock with the power of the Lord, with the majesty of the name of his God. They will live secure, for from then on he will extend his power to the ends of the land.

RESPONSE

.Lord, make us turn to you; let us see your face and we shall be saved.

He himself will be peace.

Second Reading.

A reading from the letter to the Hebrews (Hebrews 10:5-10)

This is what Christ said, on coming into the world:

You who wanted no sacrifice or oblation, prepared a body for me.

You took no pleasure in holocausts or sacrifices for sin:

then I said,

just as I was commanded in the scroll of the book, 'God, here I am! I am coming to obey your will.'

Notice that he says first: You did not want what the Law lays down as the things to be offered, that is: the sacrifices, the oblations, the holocausts and the sacrifices for sin, and you took no pleasure in them; and then he says: Here I am! I am coming to obey your will. He is abolishing the first sort to replace it with the second. And this will was for us to be made holy by the offering of his body made once and for all by Jesus Christ.

For the moment your greeting reached my ears, the child in my womb leapt for joy. Yes, blessed is she who believed that the promise made her by the Lord would be fulfilled.'
