Eighth Sunday in Ordinary Time Year C 2.3.2025

Dear sisters and brothers in Christ

The Gospel for this Sunday's Liturgy of the Word encourages us to reflect on our words:

Do we speak from 'the store of goodness' in our heart, or do we find ourselves drawing from 'the store of badness'?

Indeed, our First Reading says something similar: 'Do not praise anyone before they have spoken, since this is the test of people'.

So, the tongue (one's words) are a clear indication of inner thoughts.

Most of us find ourselves critical of this or that, this person or that person. We often listen to the negative comments about another rather than see the good that they are trying to do. We can easily condemn and pull down, but struggle to praise and build up. We listen to trolls on social media; we subscribe to those who criticise others on YouTube; we applaud the destructive voices of those narcissistic politicians and leaders who are the scourge of contemporary democracy. And we can blame God for all the things that go wrong in our lives, even if we or other human beings are the true cause of difficulties.

So, my friends, are we going to do something about this? Can we start to cooperate with God's grace and start cleansing ourselves of the 'store of badness' and allow the 'store of goodness' to be uppermost in all we do and say?

Let's conclude with St Paul:

'Never give in, then, my brothers and sisters, never admit defeat; keep on working at the Lord's work always, knowing that, in the Lord, you cannot be labouring in vain.'

The World Day of Social Justice:

Last Friday, 20 February, was World Day of Social Justice. In Catholic Outlook, Fr Andrew Hamilton SJ writes "The cry for justice comes naturally to all human beings. Children protest that 'it isn't fair'. Adults ask their torturers, 'Why do you hurt me?' Justice has to do with relationships. In families, justice has to do with personal relationships between parents and children and between siblings. In schools, between teachers and students.

Justice, however, has also to do with the **human relationships between** groups of people, institutions, nations and our environment. These relationships have to do with **social** justice." He concludes "Our society puts a high value on human flourishing but often sees it as an individual right and entitlement. That view emphasises conflict and competition in resolving disputes. First Reading.

A reading from the book of Ecclesiasticus (Sirach 27:4-7)

In a shaken sieve the rubbish is left behind,

so too the defects of people appear in their talk.

Death, where is your victory? Death, where is your sting? Now the sting of death is sin, and sin gets its power from the Law. So let us thank God for giving us the victory through our Lord Jesus Christ.

Never give in then, my dear brothers and sisters, never admit defeat; keep on working at the Lord's work always, knowing that, in the Lord, you cannot be labouring in vain.

ACCLAMATION

Alleluia, alleluia! Shine on the world like bright stars; you are offering it the word of life. Alleluia!

GOSPEL

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Luke (Luke 6:39-45)

Jesus told a parable to his disciples, 'Can one blind person guide another? Surely both will fall into a pit? The disciple is not superior to his teacher; the fully trained disciple will always be like the teacher. Why do you observe the splinter in your neighbour's eye and never notice the plank in your own? How can you say to your neighbour, "Friend, let me take out the splinter that is in your eye," when you cannot see the plank in your own? Hypocrite! Take the plank out of your own eye first, and then you will see clearly enough to take out the splinter that is in your neighbour's eye.

'There is no sound tree that produces rotten fruit, nor again a rotten tree that produces sound fruit. For every tree can be told by its own fruit: people do not pick figs from thorns, nor gather grapes from brambles. A good person draws what is good from the store of goodness in their heart; a bad person draws what is bad from the store of badness. For one's words flow out of what fills one's heart.'
