The Most Holy Trinity Year C 15.6 2025

Dear sisters and brothers in Christ

The responsorial Psalm poses the question to us on this Solemnity of the Holy Trinity:

"When I see the heavens, the work of your hands, the moon and the stars which you arranged,

what is man that you should keep him in mind, mortal man that you care for him?"

Well, the answer lies in the reading. We are important because we are part of God's plan for creation. Look at what the first reading says:

"I was by his side, a master craftsman, delighting him day after day, ever at play in his presence,

at play everywhere in his world, delighting to be with the sons of men."

God's creative Spirit delighted to be with us. This presence of the Spirit, given to us through the Incarnation of Christ, is the grace that allows us to look forward to the glory of God.

The glory of God, the manifestation of God through all creation, when ultimately all of creation is united in Christ and a new Heaven and New Earth come into being. But this is still in progress, just as the Incarnation is still in progress because we are still growing into the Body of Christ, becoming one with Him, and through us all creation.

This is why we are so important. We are the link between the physical and the spiritual which brings the two together. Through humanity creation itself will be drawn into Christ and through Him into the Trinity.

But how is this accomplished?

The Mass.

Here we enter into the Eucharistic prayer which puts us in the garden of Gethsemane and the foot of the cross at Calvary, and here we join with Christ in saying; "Father, not my will, but your will be done in our lives". We join ourselves to Christ as an offering to the Father. This unification which we consummate by receiving our Lord in Communion.

Here we start to adopt the will of God, the will which is common among the persons of the Trinity, the will which Jesus in His humanity adopted allowing the new and everlasting Covenant to be established through which we become the adopted children of God.

Why?

So, we can take Christ out into the world and renew the face of the earth.

No One Chooses to be Homeless

More than 35,000 people in NSW are experiencing homelessness – the most in any State or Territory in Australia. There is no one face of homelessness and people of all ages and backgrounds are susceptible. It's never a choice but sometimes it's the only option. As many of you will know, we have homeless people in our own local community. Homelessness can also occur quite suddenly, as evidenced by the many people affected by the recent flood disaster in the mid North Coast.

At Blackheath Vinnies, we regularly work with people experiencing and at risk of homelessness, providing individual assistance with such things as food, clothing, utility bills and accommodation. And one of our members was recently able to assist as a Vinnies volunteer at a recovery centre in Maitland for people affected by the recent flood disaster.

We are able to make an impact with people experiencing or at risk of homelessness, because of the generosity and goodwill shown by you as supporters of our Vinnies Appeals. We thank you sincerely for that generosity.

Blackheath Conference

***Both the first reading and the psalm response celebrate the marvels of creation and the marvelous creator who brought them into being. Proverbs states that God created all of these things through Wisdom. While later theology will identify

through Wisdom. While later theology will identify Wisdom with both the Word of God, the second person of the Trinity, and the Holy Spirit, the third person, the reading itself does not suggest this.

Paul credits God with our justification through faith. Justification or salvation is accomplished by God through our Lord Jesus Christ. The love of God is poured into our hearts through the Holy Spirit. Paul does not clearly state that the love of God that we receive through the Holy Spirit sanctifies us, but one could certainly understand it in this way.

John's theology resembles very closely that of Paul. In it, Jesus reveals the intimate connection between himself and the Father as well as himself and the Spirit. The Spirit continues the mission of Jesus, neither adding anything to his teaching nor omitting anything from it.

While this is a feast that glorifies the central mystery of our faith, a mystery that is based on the way the three divine persons relate to each other, the readings all address ways that God relates to us. If we concentrate, as the texts for today suggest that we do, on all of the ways that our Triune God has blessed us, we may be more inclined to cry out with the psalmist: 'O Lord, our God, how wonderful your name in all the earth!'

Social Justice Presentation by Josephite Sister

On June 21, Sr. Susan Connelly rsj, will be giving a presentation unpacking the Bishops' Social Justice statement of 2024/25 - TRUTH & PEACE: A Gospel Word in a Violent World. Sister Susan has extensive experience in Primary School education and teaching scripture in public schools.

This Statement by the bishops "scrutinises the signs of the times.....sees the violence and asks why the world is as it is and what is needed for there to be peace". The Statement notes the erosion of truth is contributing to the violence, and the part that social media plays towards this erosion.

This may be a timely presentation to inform us how we might play a part in challenging where truth is being a victim of disinformation and misinformation to which the Statement makes an extensive reference.

Jesus said to his disciples:
