Saints Peter and Paul, Apostles

29.6 2025

Dear sisters and brothers in Christ

For the Solemnity of St Peter and St Paul we have three readings. The first is the miraculous escape of St Peter from prison. The second is St Paul reflecting on his life, and the Gospel where St Peter identifies Jesus as the Christ, the Son of God and is selected by Christ to be the "rock" on which the Church will be built.

St Peter and St Paul were very different. St Peter was a fisherman, so not highly educated but a man who had to work with his hands and manage a business and staff. So not a simple man by any means. St Paul was a highly educated Pharisee, educated in the Judaic tradition but also very well educated in Greek Philosophy. Two very different men. One more or less an academic, the other a businessman. Both developed by God for the specific roles they were to play

These two were the means through which the Spirit spread the faith in Christ across the world.

What united them was their longing to see the Kingdom of God realised. They saw the value of the Kingdom so they longed for God to work through them, and they opened themselves to go to any lengths to do God's will.

And God supported them. He broke Peter out of Prison, from the clutches of Herod who wanted to kill him to make himself popular with the Jews.

And St Peter did eventually die a martyr, but he had long again given his life for Christ. That's exactly what St Paul is saying, he's already "run the race" given his life for Christ. So, St Pauls execution was in his eyes only the final note in a life sacrificed for Christ.

What does this mean for us. We are called to be evangelists. We are called to live for Christ. Be as Christ like as possible in our work, our relationships, in our dealings with people, in our prayers and in our thoughts and attitudes. We too have been developed by God for our functions.

We too are meant to convert the world, our spheres of influence, not so much with words but with actions and attitudes.

Yes, we will make mistakes, like St Peter who denied Christ, who cut off a persons' ear, but what made St Peter great was that in his heart He was devoted to Christ. He cut off the ear to protect Christ, he denied Christ only out of fear, but we must not forget he did actually follow Him when others had run. He repented his faults, and it came very easily because of His deep love for Christ. That is why he's the rock of trust and devotion that gives us the example of stability from which to go forward in life. *Deacon Alan*

<u>First Reading.</u>

A reading from the Acts of the Apostles (Acts of the Apostles 12:1-11)

King Herod started persecuting certain members of the Church. He beheaded James the brother of John, and when he saw that this pleased the Jews he decided to arrest Peter as well. This was during the days of Unleavened Bread, and he put Peter in prison, assigning four squads of four soldiers each to guard him in turns. Herod meant to try Peter in public after the end of Passover week. All the time Peter was under guard the Church prayed to God for him unremittingly.

On the night before Herod was to try him, Peter was sleeping between two soldiers, fastened with double chains, while guards kept watch at the main entrance to the prison. Then suddenly the angel of the Lord stood there, and the cell was filled with light. He tapped Peter on the side and woke him. 'Get up!' he said 'Hurry!' - and the chains fell from his hands. The angel then said, 'Put on your belt and sandals.' After he had done this, the angel next said, 'Wrap your cloak round you and follow me.' Peter followed him, but had no idea that what the angel did was all happening in reality; he thought he was seeing a vision. They passed through two guard posts one after the other, and reached the iron gate leading to the city. This opened of its own accord; they went through it and had walked the whole length of one street when suddenly the angel left him. It was only then that Peter came to himself. 'Now I know it is all true,' he said. 'The Lord really did send his angel and has saved me from Herod and from all that the Jewish people were so certain would happen to me.'

The Gospel

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Matthew (Matthew 16:13-19)

When Jesus came to the region of Caesarea Philippi he put this question to his disciples, 'Who do people say the Son of Man is?' And they said, 'Some say he is John the Baptist, some Elijah, and others Jeremiah or one of the prophets.' 'But you,' he said, 'who do you say I am?' Then Simon Peter spoke up, 'You are the Christ,' he said, 'the Son of the living God.' Jesus replied, 'Simon son of Jonah, you are a happy man! Because it was not flesh and blood that revealed this to you but my Father in heaven. So I now say to you: You are Peter and on this rock I will build my Church. And the gates of the underworld can never hold out against it. I will give you the keys of the kingdom of heaven: whatever you bind on earth shall be considered bound in heaven; whatever you loose on earth shall be considered loosed in heaven.'

<u>COMMUNION</u>: Peter said to Jesus: You are the Christ, the Son of the living God. And Jesus replied: You are Peter, and upon this rock I will build my Church .

Second Reading.

A reading from the second letter of St Paul to Timothy (2 Timothy 4:6-8, 17-18)

My life is already being poured away as a libation, and the time has come for me to be gone. I have fought the good fight to the end; I have run the race to the finish; I have kept the faith; all there is to come now is the crown of righteousness reserved for me, which the Lord, the righteous judge, will give to me on that Day; and not only to me but to all those who have longed for his Appearing.

The Lord stood by me and gave me power, so that through me the whole message might be proclaimed for all the pagans to hear; and so I was rescued from the lion's mouth. The Lord will rescue me from all evil attempts on me, and bring me safely to his heavenly kingdom. To him be glory for ever and ever. Amen.
