16th Sunday in Ordinary Times Year C 20.7 .2025

Dear sisters and brothers in Christ

Has God changed His mind between the time of Abraham and the time of Christ?

In the first reading we hear how Three Men came bye Abraham's encampment, but notice Abraham refers to them in the singular and addresses them as "My Lord", a title reserved in the Jewish Scriptures for God. So, Abraham is visited by God, the Trinity, and he orders a feast to be prepared, and it is a feast because three bushels of flour is approximately 60kg of flour and a calf is killed. This is a celebration for the entire camp in honour of their guest, God Himself. For his efforts Abraham is told that in their old age Sarah and he will have a child, and it will be a boy.

But in the Gospel Jesus tells Martha not to worry about serving and being a good hostess.

Is there a contradiction in what is being asked for by God?

No.

Because if we look at the Psalm, we see what will enable a person to live on the mountain, that is in closeness to God. It's a purity of heart. A single mindedness which drives people to do what is most important in each circumstance. A single mindedness or purity of heart that allows a person to discern what is the best thing to do.

The letter to the Colossian's reinforces this by saying that it's all about the mystery of Christ amongst us which is our "hope of glory: this is the Christ we proclaim, this is the wisdom in which we thoroughly train everyone and instruct everyone, to make them all perfect in Christ". The purity of heart relies on this desire to merge into the consciousness of Christ, the single mindedness of doing the Father's will. This is the Wisdom of God that will guide us to our glory, us reflecting the love and mercy of God into the world around us.

Because ultimately each of us has a personal relationship with God and like in any relationship we must be ready to give, but also to receive. Abraham gave and was open to receive, Martha was too caught up in giving, missing out on what was being offered to her.

Likewise, we too must not get too carried away with what we will do and give. We must sometimes pause and look at what is being offered and accept it so that we do what God wants the way God wants it done, not our way.

The Gospel

First Reading.

A reading from the book of Genesis (Genesis 18:1-10)

The Lord appeared to Abraham at the Oak of Mamre while he was sitting by the entrance of the tent during the hottest part of the day. He looked up, and there he saw three men standing near him. As soon as he saw them he ran from the entrance of the tent to meet them, and bowed to the ground. 'My lord,' he said, 'I beg you, if I find favour with you, kindly do not pass your servant by. A little water shall be brought; you shall wash your feet and lie down under the tree. Let me fetch a little bread and you shall refresh yourselves before going further. That is why you have come in your servant's direction.' They replied, 'Do as you say.'

Abraham hastened to the tent to find Sarah. 'Hurry,' he said, 'knead three bushels of flour and make loaves.' Then running to the cattle Abraham took a fine and tender calf and gave it to the servant, who hurried to prepare it. Then taking cream, milk and the calf he had prepared, he laid all before them, and they ate while he remained standing near them under the tree.

'Where is your wife Sarah?' they asked him. 'She is in the tent,' he replied. Then his guest said, 'I shall visit you again next year without fail and your wife will then have a son.'
