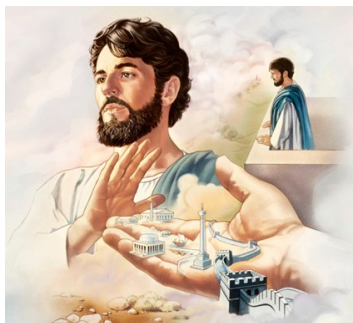

REFLECTION ON THE READINGS

Dear sisters and brothers in Christ

The Temptations of Jesus are always placed before us on the First Sunday of Lent each year (whether from Matthew, Mark or Luke). CHANGES TO MAIN GATE OPERATION

ST CANICE'S CHURCH DRIVEWAY:

The current setup for the main driveway gates enables users to access the property after hours via the keypad installed in the driveway. However, to close the gates they need to exit their vehicles and re-enter the access code to close the gates. To enable after hours users a greater level of security and safety access to the property after hours will be as follows:

Entry: Enter pin into keypad to open gates – proceed through gates – Gates will automatically close after your vehicle passes the newly installed sensors.

Exit: Drive to gate and vehicle sensors installed in the driveway will open the gates. Exit driveway and the gates will automatically close, there is no need to enter the pin code on exiting the property.

Normal hours (6am to 6pm) gate operation will remain unchanged.

WORKING WITH CHILDREN CHECK / SAFEGUARDING

In the Diocese of Parramatta all employees, volunteers, clergy, religious, contractors and sub-contractors engaged in parish or ministry work must understand their obligations in relation to the Safeguarding Policies. Not all volunteers require a Working With Children Check but the provision of this check is mandatory for the following positions and Ministries: Clergy – Staff – Minister of the Altar – SRE Teacher – Sacramental Teams and St. Vincent de Paul Society. **We are asking those involved to please update or obtain a Working With Children Check and once obtained send details to the Parish Office Email: upperbluemountains@parracatholic.org so that we may notify the Diocese.** Thank you to all those who give their time and talent for the benefit of our Parish and the building up of the Kingdom of God here in the beautiful Blue Mountains.

2026 ACBC Social Justice Statement on the cost of living. The Australian Bishops have released the first of two Social Justice Statements for 2026, titled "*The Cost of our Living: Economic and Social Justice for the Common Good*". The new statement and accompanying resources can be found at socialjustice.catholic.org.au.

The NSW Government is reviewing the State's euthanasia (Voluntary Assisted Dying) laws and is calling for public feedback until 26 February. This is an important chance for Christians to advocate for faith-based aged care homes, which are currently required to allow euthanasia on their premises, even when it conflicts with their beliefs. A proposed amendment to give faith-based providers the same right as hospitals to transfer residents off-site did not pass last year. With strong public support now, we have an opportunity to push for this vital protection again. First Sunday of Lent

ENTRANCE ANTIPHON

When he calls on me, I will answer him; I will deliver him and give him glory, I will grant him length of days.

FIRST READING (Genesis 2:7-9, 3:1-7)

The Lord God fashioned man of dust from the soil. Then he breathed into his nostrils a breath of life, and thus man became a living being. The Lord God planted a garden in Eden which is in the east, and there he put the man he had fashioned. The Lord God caused to spring up from the soil every kind of tree, enticing to look at and good to eat, with the tree of life and the tree of the knowledge of good and evil in the middle of the garden. The serpent was the most subtle of all the wild beasts that the Lord God had made.

It asked the woman, 'Did God really say you were not to eat from any of the trees in the garden?' The woman answered the serpent, 'We may eat the fruit of the trees in the garden. But of the fruit of the tree in the middle of the garden God said, "You must not eat it, nor touch it, under pain of death".' Then the serpent said to the woman, 'No! You will not die! God knows in fact that on the day you eat it your eyes will be opened and you will be like gods, knowing good and evil.' The woman saw that the tree was good to eat and pleasing to the eye, and that it was desirable for the knowledge that it could give. So she took some of its fruit and ate it. She gave some also to her husband who was with her, and he ate it. Then the eyes of both of them were opened and they realised that they were naked. So they sewed fig-leaves together to make themselves loin-cloths.

RESPONSORIAL PSALM

Be merciful, O Lord, for we have sinned.

SECOND READING (Romans 5:12, 17-19)

Sin entered the world through one man, and through sin death, and thus death has spread through the whole human race because everyone has sinned. If it is certain that death reigned over everyone as the consequence of one man's fall, it is even more certain that one man, Jesus Christ, will cause everyone to reign in life who receives the free gift that he does not deserve, of being made righteous.

Again, as one man's fall brought condemnation on everyone, so the good act of one man brings everyone life and makes them justified. As by one man's

disobedience many were made sinners, so by one man's obedience many will be made righteous.

GOSPEL ACCLAMATION

Praise to you, Lord Jesus Christ, king of endless glory! No one lives on bread alone, but on every word that comes from the mouth of God. Praise to you, Lord Jesus Christ, king of endless glory!

GOSPEL (Matthew 4:1-11)

Jesus was led by the Spirit out into the wilderness to be tempted by the devil. He fasted for forty days and forty nights, after which he was very hungry, and the tempter came and said to him, 'If you are the Son of God, tell these stones to turn into loaves.' But he replied, 'Scripture says: Man does not live on bread alone but on every word that comes from the mouth of God.'

The devil then took him to the holy city and made him stand on the parapet of the Temple. 'If you are the Son of God,' he said, 'throw yourself down; for scripture says: He will put you in his angels' charge, and they will support you on their hands in case you hurt your foot against a stone.' Jesus said to him, 'Scripture also says: You must not put the Lord your God to the test.'

Next, taking him to a very high mountain, the devil showed him all the kingdoms of the world and their splendour. 'I will give you all these', he said, 'if you fall at my feet and worship me.' Then Jesus replied, 'Be off, Satan! For scripture says: You must worship the Lord your God, and serve him alone.' Then the devil left him, and angels appeared and looked after him.
